Although many plants attract hummingbirds, the most appealing plants to hummingbirds have flowers which are tubular in shape, and many (but not all) are red. Remember to provide nectar sources from late spring through first frost, convenient places for hummers to nest and perch, and a water source (sprinklers work well).

Also keep in mind that using pesticides eliminates many of the small insects hummingbirds rely on for protein.
